

COMBER: Community-based research workshop



On 25 and 26 January 2022 COMBER held a community-based action research workshop to introduce new researchers to the foundational principles of community-based research, to learn where and how to position oneself as a community-based researcher, and how to grow as a community-based researcher. This workshop was facilitated by Prof L Wood, Prof M Koen, Prof L de Sousa and Dr M Neethling, who are experienced practitioners in community-based research in their respective fields. Attendees gave positive feedback and were motivated to begin their research journey to make a positive change through research.

Proposal writing workshop



On 27 and 28 January 2022 Prof Lesley Wood facilitated a proposal writing workshop for all new COMBER MEd and PhD students, as well as their supervisors/promoters. This workshop aimed to assist new students with regard to drafting their proposals in the paradigm required by community-based research (CBR). It also enabled the founding of good relationships between supervisor and student.

Prof Wood addressed aspects such as the title, research questions, theoretical framework, research designs suited to COMBER, and ethics considerations. This informative workshop prepared the ground for COMBER students to begin their proposal writing journey with the support of their supervisors to bring about change through community-based educational research.
