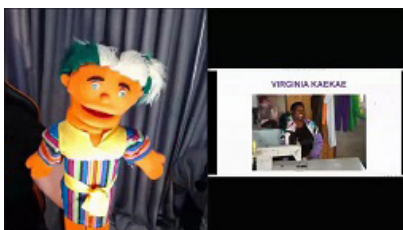
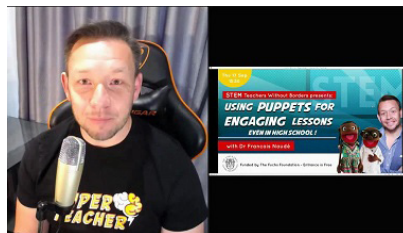
Puppets Without Borders Webinar

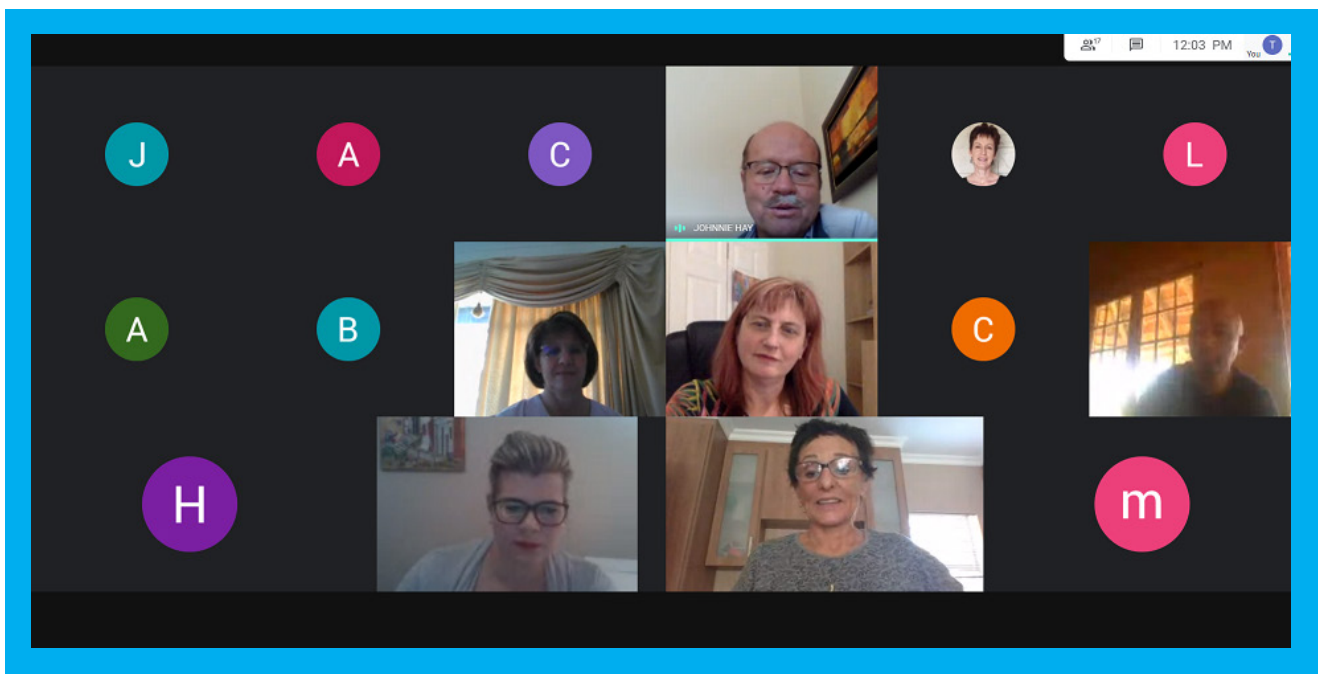

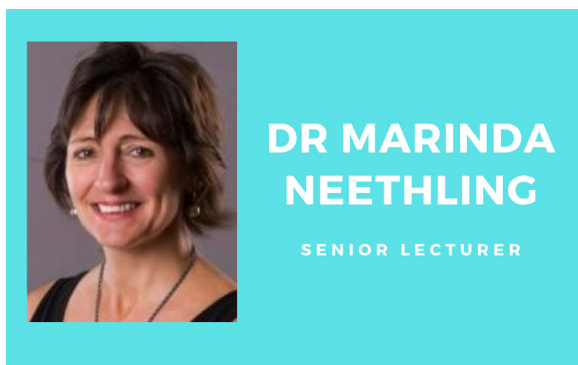
