## NWU se virtuele ekskursies inspireer superkundiges

Die Fakulteit Opvoedkunde aan die Noordwes-Universiteit (NWU) glo dat dit meer as net 'n gewone onderwyser verg om 'n betekenisvolle bydrae in die onderwyssektor te maak - 'n superonderwyser is nodig om Suid-Afrika se jongmense te help ontwikkel, te motiveer en op te voed.

Dit is waarom die universiteit sedert 2016 met ekskursies begin het en huisende eerstejaar-BEd-studente van die NWU se drie kampusse, asook afstandstudente, byeengebring het om hulle te inspireer, op te lei en met hulle te gesels oor wat dit beteken om in die beroep van 'n onderwyser uit te blink. ## MEd and PhD student winners of the 3MT competition

Three Minute Thesis (3MT®) is a research communication competition developed by the University of Queensland (UQ). Doctoral students participating in the 3MT are given three minutes to present a compelling oration on their thesis and its significance. The 3MT challenges students to consolidate their ideas and research discoveries to be presented concisely to a non-specialist audience.

Both master's-degree and doctoral students will compete at institutional level, but qualifying doctoral students will continue to the national competition held by the University of the Free State.

Thirty-four master's-degree students and 58 doctoral students uploaded abstracts, but only 36 doctoral students and 20 master's-degree students uploaded their video presentation for evaluation.

Winners were announced on 23 August 2021 and they will compete in the NWU's institutional competition. This will be the finals for master's-degree students and the semi-finals for doctoral students. Both categories will receive prize money in the NWU's institutional competition.

"Three Minute Thesis" (3MT®) is 'n navorsingskommunikasiekompetisie wat deur die Universiteit van Queensland (UQ) ontwikkel is. Studente wat aan die 3MT deelneem, kry drie minute tyd om 'n oortuigende bespreking van hulle proefskrif en die betekenis daarvan voor te lê.

Die 3MT daag studente uit om hulle idees en navorsingsontdekings te konsolideer om dit kortlik aan 'n nie-spesialis-gehoor voor te lê.

Beide meestersgraad- en doktorale studente sal op institutionele vlak meeding, maar kwalifiserende doktorale studente gaan deur na die nasionale kompetisie wat deur die Universiteit van die Vrystaat gehou word.

Vier-en-dertig meestersgraad- en 58 doktorale studente het opsommings opgelaai, maar slegs 36 doktorale en 20 meestersgraadstudente het hul videovoerlegging vir evaluering opgelaai.

Wenner is op 23 Augustus 2021 aangekondig en sal aan die NWU se institutionele kompetisie deelneem. Dit is die eindronde vir meestersgraad- en die halfeindronde vir doktorale studente. Beide kategorieë sal in die NWU se institutionele kompetisie prysgeld ontvang.





## Navorsingseenheid vir Selfgerigte Leer se virtuele skryfwerkswinkel



## Recent activities of the Research Unit for Self-Directed Learning


