VERKEN AKSIENAVORSING: COMBER-YouTube-kanaal



Prof Iman Chahine facilitated an SDL discourse on research design

On Thursday, 8 October 2020 Prof Iman Chahine, an extraordinary professor in the Research Unit: Self-Directed Learning, facilitated an SDL discourse on research design. Prof Chahine is a researcher associated with the University of Massachusetts-Lowell, and, as part of a Fulbright scholarship, spent the first semester of 2020 at the North-West University, where she participated in SDL research. Professor Chahine is a leading ethno-mathematician, and a strong focus of her work is on how people at all levels of society (especially street vendors) learn mathematical concepts as self-directed learners. She therefore facilitated a lively discourse on research design in an SDL context, in which 35 SDL researchers participated. This particular discourse built upon a September discourse on the use of Cultural-Historical Activity Theory (CHAT) as a research lens in SDL research that was facilitated by Prof Elsa Mentz and Prof Josef de Beer. This series of virtual SDL discourses has proven to be very successful in the current Covid-19 era, as it provides researchers with an opportunity to engage, and to still experience a sense of belonging, despite the physical isolation created by the Covid-19 lockdown regulations.

Prof Iman Chahine fasiliteer 'n SDL-diskoers oor navorsingsontwerp

Op Donderdag 8 Oktober 2020 het prof Iman Chahine, 'n buitengewone professor in die Navorsingseenheid: Selfgerigte Leer, 'n SGL-diskoers geleei wat oor navorsingsontwerp gehandel het. Prof Chahine is 'n navorser van die Universiteit van Massachusetts-Lowell, en sy het die eerste semester van die jaar as deel van 'n Fulbright-beurs by die Noordwes Universiteit deurgebring. In dié tydperk het sy navorsing oor selfgerigte leer gedoen. Prof Chahine is 'n toonaangewende etno-wiskundige, en een fokus van haar werk is om te kyk na hoe mense op verskeie vlakke van die samelewing, onder andere straathandelaars (verkopers), as selfgerigte leerders wiskundekonsepte verwerf. Sy het 'n aktiewe diskloers oor navorsing in 'n SGL-konteks gefasiliteer, waaraan 35 SGL-navorsers deelgeneem het. Hierdie diskloers volg op die September-diskoers wat deur prof Elsa Mentz en prof Josef de Beer aangebied is, en wat oor die gebruik van Kultuurhistoriese Aktiwiteitsteorie in SGL-navorsing gehandel het. Dit blyk dat hierdie reeks virtuele diskloers van SDL baie suksesvol is in die huidige Covid-19-tydperk omdat dit aan navorsers die geleentheid bied om oor navorsingsake te gesels, en om 'n samehorigheidsgevoel te beleef ten spyte van die fisiese isolasie wat deur die Covid-19-inperkingsregulasies geskep word.
